Nearly 1000 members and guests registered to attend Global Resilience Federation's Summit on Security & Third-Party Risk on October 7-8. Twenty-one keynote and concurrent sessions during the two day event covered many aspects of supply chain and third party risk challenges.

LUNCH KEYNOTE ADDRESS

Lunch featured Jim Rosenthal, CEO of BlueVoyant who shared key insights and findings from their 2021 Global Insights Report. The report covered multiple industries and regions, and examined the response to cybersecurity in the supply chain. It also provided recommendations on how to manage the supply chain to protect the vendor ecosystem.

OPENING KEYNOTE: FUTURE OF THIRD-PARTY AND SUPPLY CHAIN SECURITY

The keynote address, given by representatives from KPMG and Johnson & Johnson, focused on the future of third party and supply chain security. GLOBAL RESILIENCE FEDERATION— UPDATES AND COMING ATTRACTIONS

BRC: ALL-HAZARD SHARING

GRF introduced a new multi-sector community this year to foster sharing and cooperation regarding significant all-hazard incidents, threats, vulnerabilities and other factors that impact business and operational resilience. Business Resilience Council (BRC) publishes daily and weekly reports and provides alerts on physical, geopolitical and significant cyber threats and incidents. Hundreds of organizations have already joined to support development of playbooks and an operational resilience framework (ORF) to support recovery of critical services from disruptive events. EASE: SHARING WITH DENMARK

The Energy Analytic Security Exchange (EASE) is an information sharing community of electrical, gas and other utilities in the U.S. and Europe. Sharing topics include malware, vulnerabilities in IT and OT systems, and nation-state threat actors that target ICS systems. Energi-CERT, the electrical information sharing organization of Denmark, is the newest member of EASE. It brings deep technical expertise, and has agreed to bidirectional information sharing. K12 Security Information Exchange (K12 SIX) was established last year as the first and only information sharing community focused specifically on securing U.S. K-12 education IT networks. Because of the rapid growth of this community and the supports it provides, K12 SIX was voted the Community Builder of the Year and was recently featured on NBC's The Today Show. This is a unique information sharing community dedicated to maturing cybersecurity for the sector, and enabling sharing of threats, incidents, vulnerabilities, and security practices. The Professional Services Security Information Exchange (ProSIX) was built for consulting firms of all types. KPMG and other top firms have joined together to help protect their proprietary information and the clients they serve through this collective defense effort.
