GRF Summit Recap

The 2022 Summit on Security & Third-Party Risk, more than three years in the making, was finally held in person at the Gaylord National Resort. The event included attendees from throughout North America and Singapore who had the opportunity to attend 25 different sessions with 42 speakers.

GRF Chairman Bill Nelson and CEO Mark Orsi opened the Summit, followed by remarks from Dan Menicucci of Microsoft Security. Once the opening session ended, the group broke into concurrent presentations with practitioner experts. Attendees experienced sessions on monitoring, the vendor lifecycle, cloud assessment, ransomware, and more.

Opportunities for networking included the welcome reception, transition breaks, happy hour, and the evening reception in the atrium. During breaks, vendors discussed their solutions and answered questions from the attendees. GRF's table featured details on affiliated communities, new programs from the Business Resilience Council, as well as details on the emerging GRF Foundation Scholarship.

BRC EXERCISE, ORF v1.0 & A NEW BRC CHAIRMAN

Special BRC Exercise: Geopolitical Conflict in Asia - Testing Resilience Amidst Supply Chain Disruption

Mark your calendars for December 8, 2022 from 12:30-4:30pm ET!

The BRC will host the first in a series of virtual tabletop exercises with Promontory, a business unit of IBM Consulting. As events in Ukraine have demonstrated, regional conflicts can have global impact. If an incident, or full-scale conflict, can change the way we do business we need to be prepared. The initial scenario will focus on geopolitical risk arising from tension in Asia that would create widespread supply chain impacts across many sectors. The scenario will help an organization evaluate its ability to respond to hypothetical disruptions using real-world injects borrowed from past crises and projected injects from plausible threats to come. The exercise will help organizations enhance resilience, crisis management response, roles, and responsibilities.
